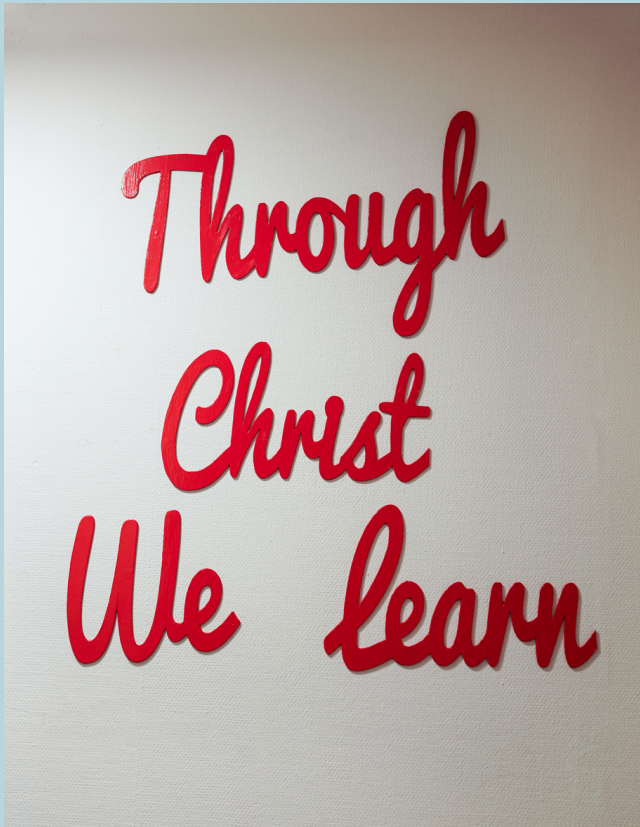

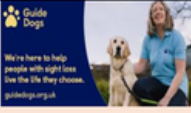
FAITH IN ACTION

Every year, St Edmund's supports a range of local, national, and global charities, teaching pupils the importance of solidarity, compassion, and justice. Recent initiatives include:

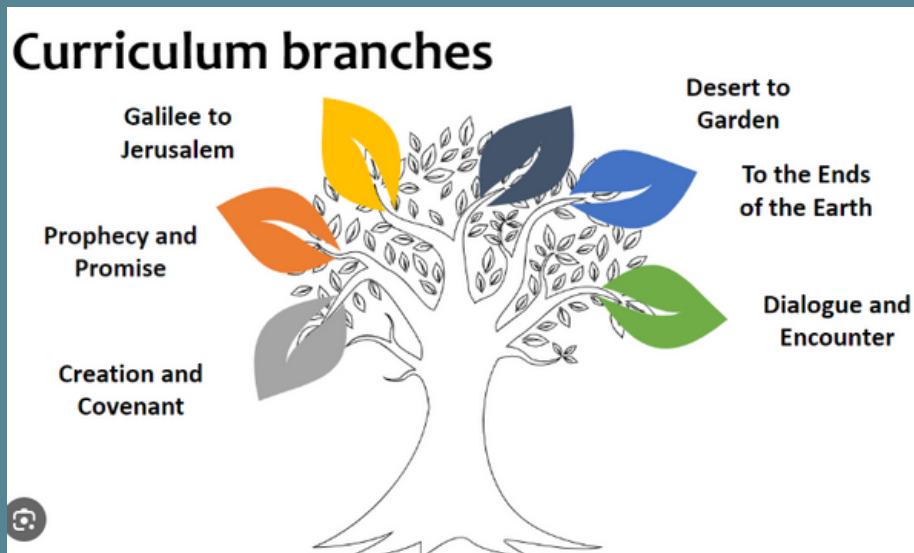

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CURRICULUM

We follow the To Know You More Clearly scheme, which ensures depth, progression, and relevance across all year groups. Children learn through:

- Scripture – exploring the life and teachings of Jesus, the Old Testament, and the mission of the Church.
- Branches of Learning – six key themes: Creation and Covenant, Prophecy and Promise, Galilee to Jerusalem, Desert to Garden, To the Ends of the Earth, Dialogue and Encounter.
- World Faiths – alongside Catholic teaching, children learn about Judaism, Islam, and other world religions to promote respect and inclusivity.



PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- Daily Prayer – in every classroom, including traditional prayers and spontaneous reflection.
- Weekly Assemblies – Celebration of the Word / Gospel assemblies on Mondays and monthly SPIRIT (Service, Perseverance, Integrity, Respect, Inclusivity, Trust) celebration assemblies (parents invited every last Friday of the month).
- Liturgical Celebrations – Masses, Advent, Lent, Holy Week, and feast days.
- Prayer Garden Initiative – classes take turns leading creative prayer activities (e.g., Prayer Pebbles, Balloon Prayers, Sand Tray Confession).

LIVING OUR SPIRIT VALUES

- By weaving together RE lessons, worship, charity, and community service, we nurture children to be compassionate, resilient, faith-filled individuals. Our pupils learn to see faith not just as knowledge, but as a way of living—serving God by serving others.

THREE WAYS OF KNOWING

IN EVERY LESSON, PUPILS GROW IN:

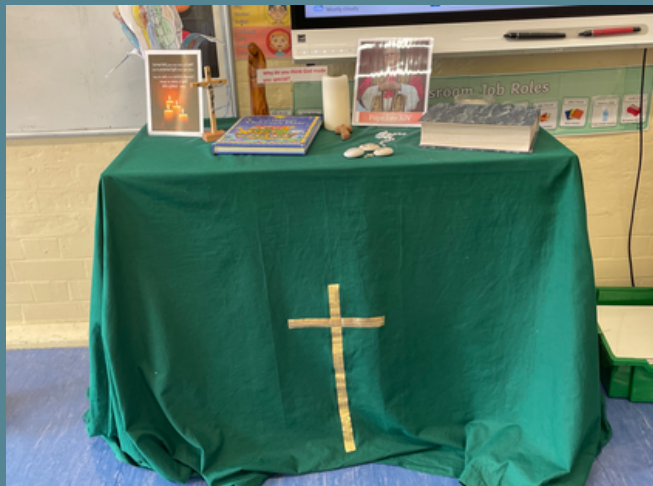


PRAYER PROGRESSION AT ST EDMUND'S

At St Edmund's, prayer is at the heart of everything we do. From Nursery to Year 6, pupils are gradually introduced to the prayers of the Church, different ways of praying, and opportunities to lead prayer themselves. This ensures that by the time they leave us, children can confidently take part in the liturgical life of the Church and develop their own personal relationship with God.

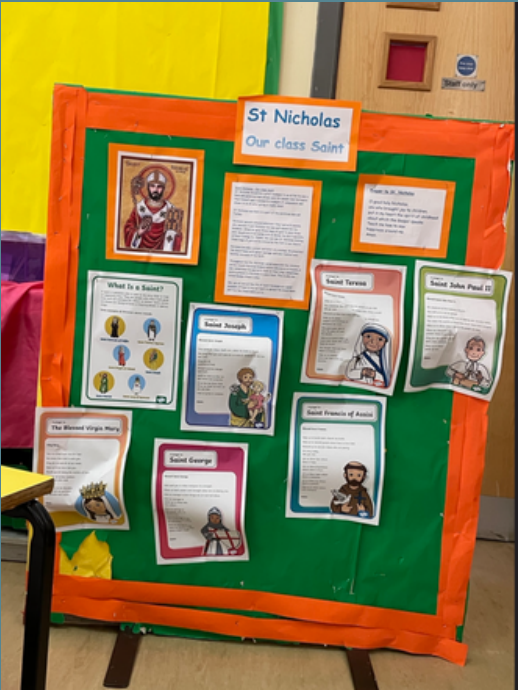
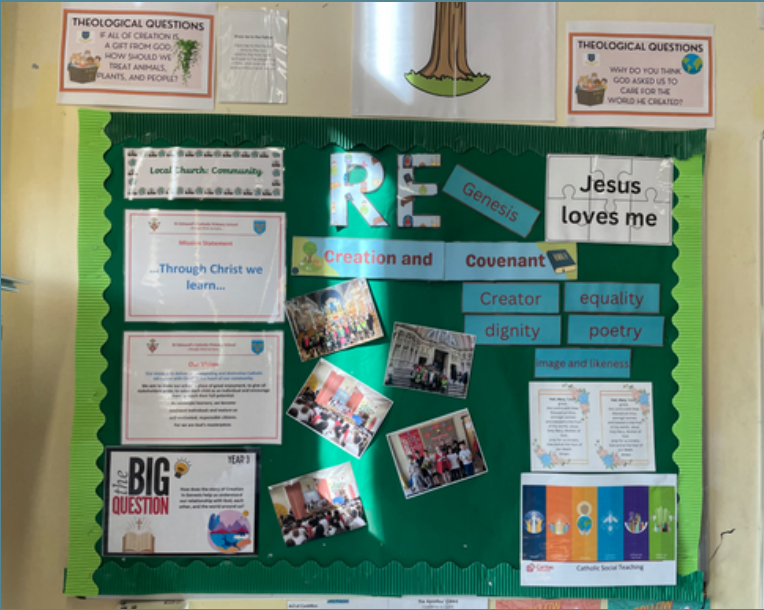
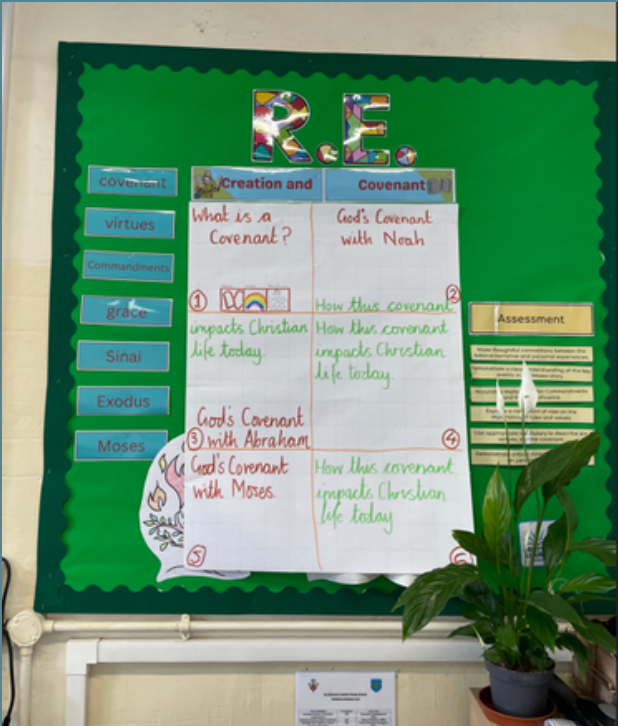

CELEBRATION OF THE WORD ASSEMBLY – LED BY OUR PEACE AND JUSTICE SOCIETY ✨

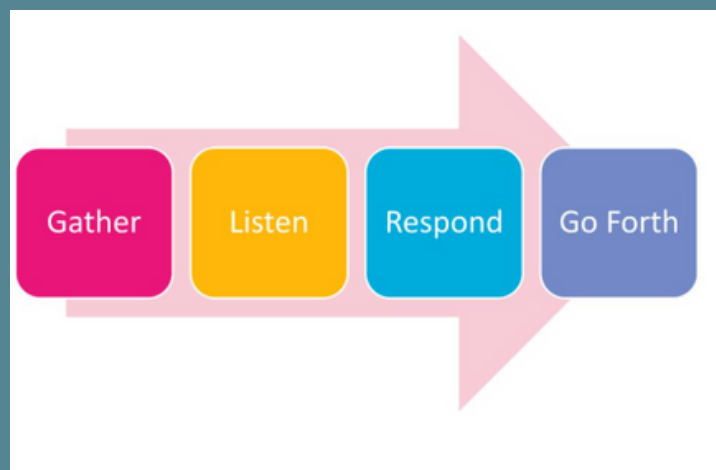
Every Monday morning, our school family gathers for our whole-school Celebration of the Word, led by the Peace and Justice Society. This is a special moment in our week where pupils take the lead in prayer, scripture, and reflection, helping us to root everything we do in the Gospel.

The assembly follows the four key steps of Collective Worship:

- ✝ We Gather – We begin with the Sign of the Cross, music, and a prayerful focus to remind us we are part of God's family.
- 📖 We Listen – The Gospel is proclaimed, and children reflect on what God is saying to us.
- 🙏 We Respond – Through prayers, songs, or creative actions, we respond to God's Word together.
- 🌍 We Go Forth – We leave with a mission: to live out the Gospel message in our words, actions, and choices throughout the week.

These assemblies inspire our pupils to live with faith, justice, and compassion, carrying the light of Christ into their classrooms, homes, and community.

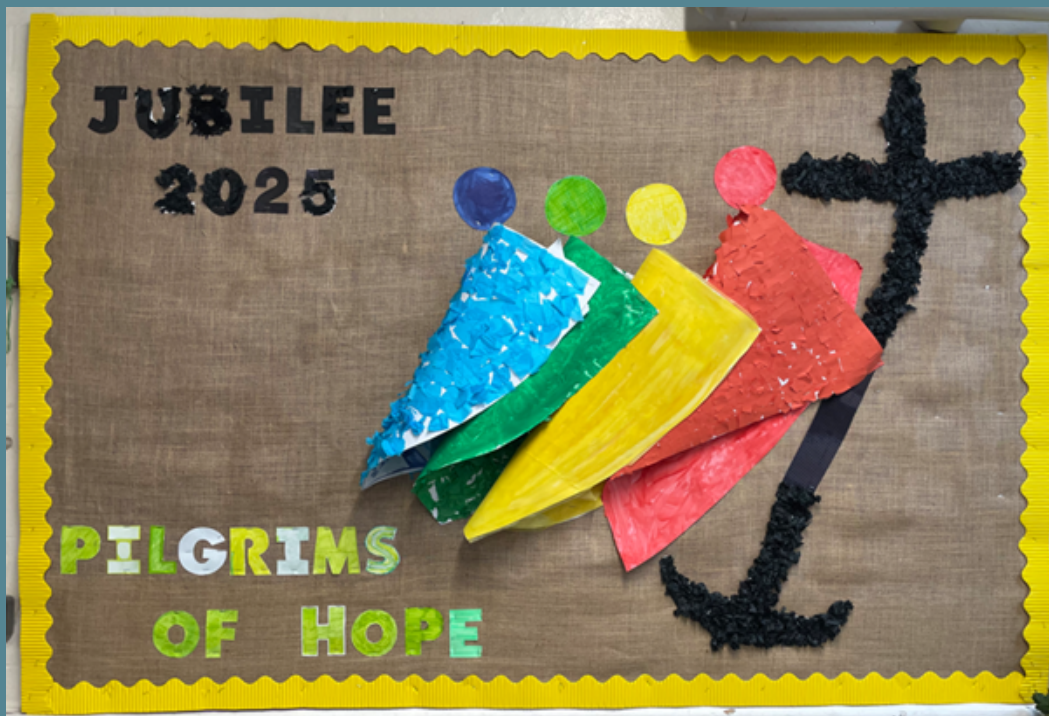

GATHER – LISTEN – RESPOND – GO FORTH.

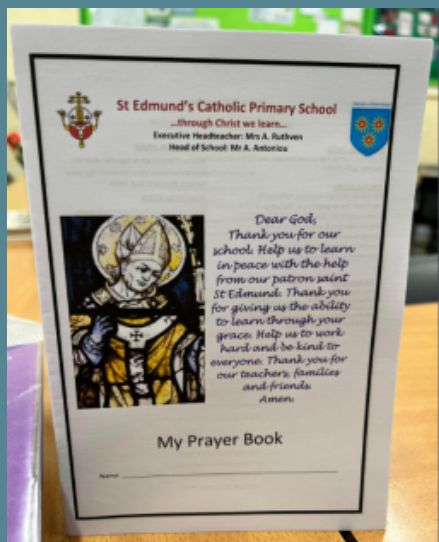
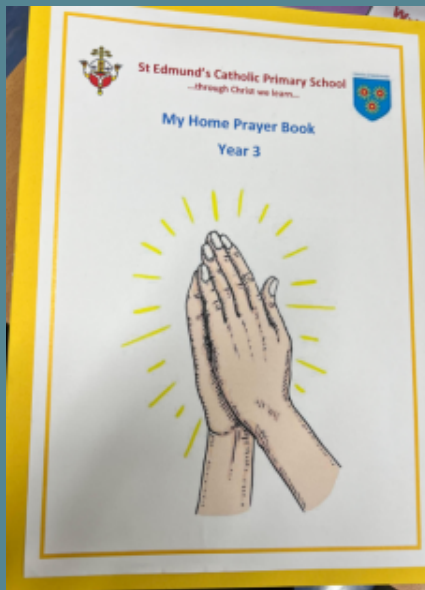
TOGETHER, PARENTS AND CHILDREN CAN:

LEAD THEIR OWN PRAYERS AS A FAMILY.

WRITE REFLECTIONS OR INTENTIONS IN THE PRAYER BOOK.

TAKE PHOTOGRAPHS OR CREATE DRAWINGS OF THEIR PRAYER SPACE OR SPECIAL MOMENTS OF PRAYER, AND ADD THEM TO THE BOOK.

THIS PRACTICE HELPS CHILDREN GROW IN CONFIDENCE AS PRAYER LEADERS AND GIVES FAMILIES THE JOY OF SHARING FAITH AT HOME. WHEN THE PRAYER BOOK IS RETURNED TO SCHOOL, CHILDREN SHARE THEIR FAMILY'S CONTRIBUTIONS WITH PRIDE DURING CLASS OR CELEBRATION OF THE WORD ASSEMBLIES.





CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING AT ST EDMUND'S

AT ST EDMUND'S, CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING (CST) IS AT THE HEART OF OUR MISSION: "THROUGH CHRIST WE LEARN." CST SHAPES HOW WE PRAY, HOW WE LEARN, AND HOW WE ACT IN THE WORLD. IT ENSURES OUR PUPILS UNDERSTAND THAT FAITH IS NOT JUST WHAT WE BELIEVE, BUT HOW WE LIVE.



ROOTED IN LOVE

We follow the Caritas "Rooted in Love" programme, developed with the Diocese of Westminster.

Each half-term, pupils focus on one CST theme such as:

Human Dignity

Solidarity,

Care for Creation

The Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

These themes are woven into RE lessons, assemblies, prayer, and daily school life.



EVERY TERM CHILDREN LEARN ABOUT THE CST TOPIC REFLECT ON IT AND SUGGEST THEIR OWN IDEAS, THEIR UNDERSTANDING AND REFLECTIONS. THEY WRITE THEIR OWN PRAYERS, PETITIONS, DREAMS AND HOPES AROUND THE WORLD AROUND THEM AND THEIR FAMILIES.

PUPIL CHOICE AND ACTION

At the start of every autumn term, each class chooses a charity to support for the year. Together, pupils discuss and vote on causes close to their hearts – whether local, national, or global. They reflect on:

- Why does this charity matter?
- Who are we helping?
- How does this connect to the Gospel and CST?

This ensures every fundraising project is rooted in pupil voice and theological reflection. Children take pride in their choice and are motivated to plan creative fundraising events that make a real difference.

LIVING CST IN OUR SCHOOL

Our pupils act for justice and compassion at every level:

- **Local:** Classes support food banks, parish initiatives, and local hospices. Projects include the Rudolph Run for St Joseph's Hospice and harvest donations. (Insert food bank photos)
- **National:** Pupils contribute to campaigns such as Children in Need, Young Minds, and Macmillan, understanding that they are part of a national community of action. (Insert cake sale / fundraiser photos)

Diversity is celebrated through:

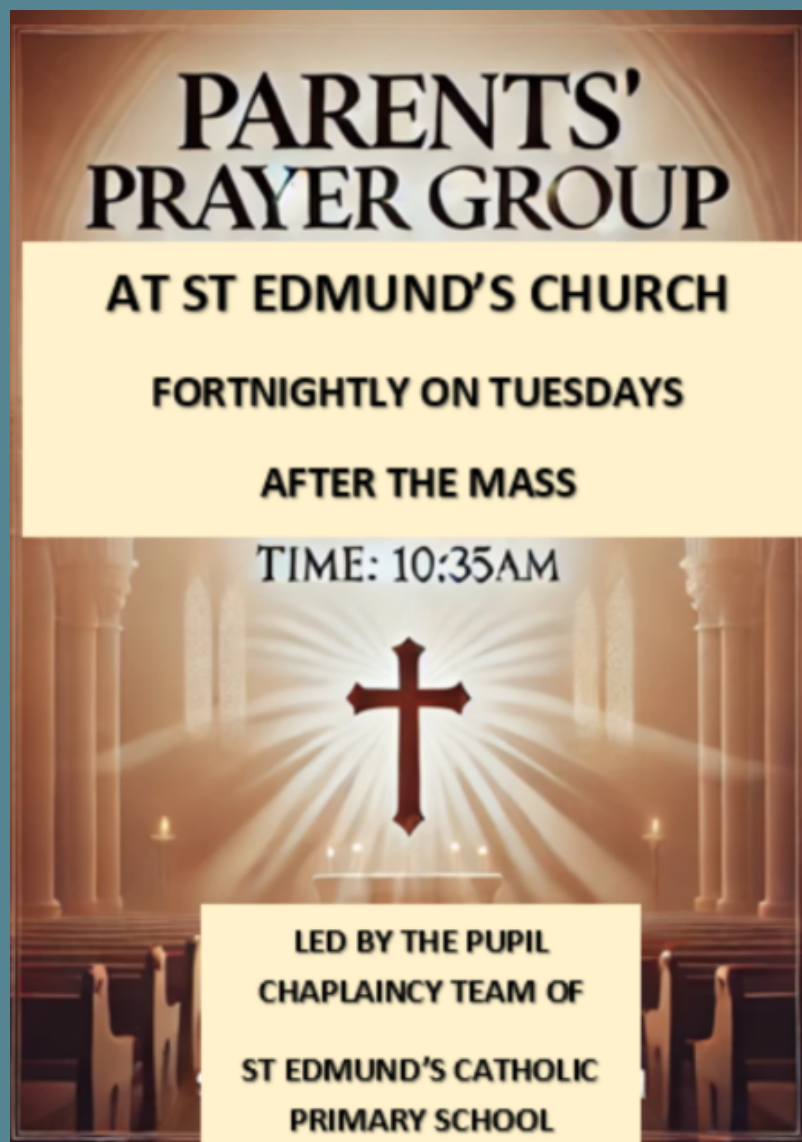
Assemblies and Collective Worship that highlight unity, equality, and justice in the light of the Gospel.

RELATIONSHIPS, SEX AND HEALTH EDUCATION (RSE) AND PSHE AT ST EDMUND'S

At St Edmund's, we believe that every child is created in the image and likeness of God, uniquely loved and called to flourish. Our Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSE) and PSHE curriculum enables children to grow in knowledge, respect, and responsibility, preparing them to live safe, healthy, and faith-filled lives.

We follow Life to the Full Plus, a comprehensive programme developed by Ten Ten Resources and approved by the Catholic Education Service. This scheme is fully in line with the statutory requirements for Relationships and Health Education, while being rooted in the teachings of the Catholic Church.

WHAT CHILDREN LEARN

The programme is structured across three key themes, which are revisited and deepened from Early Years to Year 6:

1. Created and Loved by God
 - Recognising the dignity of every person as created in God's image.
 - Learning about physical and emotional health, life cycles, and the uniqueness of each individual.
2. Created to Love Others
 - Understanding relationships, family life, friendship, and online safety.
 - Exploring how to form healthy, respectful and loving relationships, both offline and online.
3. Created to Live in Community
 - Appreciating our role in wider society and the Church.
 - Learning about responsibilities, Catholic Social Teaching, and caring for others and creation.

Each module is age-appropriate, with a clear progression of knowledge and theological language. Prayer, reflection, and Scripture are woven throughout, ensuring that children connect what they learn with their faith.

HOW IT IS TAUGHT

1. Lessons are interactive and sensitive, using film, story, discussion, and prayer.
2. Teachers adapt materials to support children's needs, ensuring inclusivity.
3. Parents are given access to the Ten Ten Parent Portal, so that home and school work together in guiding children.



LIFE TO THE FULL – PARENT INFORMATION

At St Edmund's we follow Life to the Full, a Relationships, Health and Sex Education (RHE) programme created by Ten Ten Resources and approved by the Diocese of Westminster.
