Doodle Your Way to Maths and English Progress

As you may be aware, children in St. Edmund's (from Butterflies to Year 6) have access to Doodle Maths. They can also access Doodle English now to support and extend their reading, writing and grammar. With both of these packages, children can also download Doodle Spell (to practise spellings) and Doodle Tables (to practise times tables). We strongly recommend allowing your children access to these apps where possible, as they are a fun and engaging way of learning. Children may also earn goodies and certificates in school based on their effort and hard work on the apps.
