



Primary Works

How do we treat people we don't know?





In every country in the world live people of different race, culture and identity.

Cultures merge as new people bring customs with them from their old country, but they also adopt the culture of their new country.




You can try food from different cultures in the restaurants of most cities.




Poor World

The countries of the world are at different stages of development.






Life in less
